A Letter from the Mayor



As we progress into the new year of 2023, much of what is happening in Walker continues to center around our five key priorities: Public Safety; Roads and Infrastructure; Finances; Parks and Recreation; and Quality of Life. I will give a brief update and outlook on our strategies for each of these in 2023.

As far as public safety goes, this is the most important thing in our community. As we continue to experience the growth in our City, it requires us to be thinking ahead to the staffing, equipment, and technology needs to support that growth. I believe that as we continue to budget in 2023 for these increased needs, we are making sure that Walker maintains its reputation as a safe place in which to live, work, and grow.

For our roads and infrastructure, the biggest announcement the City received in many years is the state appropriation of \$25 million for the replacement of the Fruit Ridge Bridge. This news is significant on so many fronts, and the planning and design work has already begun. Other planning and design work being done this year include the Bristol Avenue Railroad Bridge; North Center Drive Traffic Circle; Kinney Avenue improvements (between Leonard and Lake Michigan Drive), as well as actual construction, hopefully, on the intersection improvements at Kinney and Remembrance Road.

Walker's financial picture has arguably never been better in our City's history. Currently, we still do not maintain any long-term debt and our general fund balance (cash reserves) is healthy. However, we have some significant projects coming our way such as the expansion of the current Walker Library that will require investment levels we have not seen in many years. So, in summary, we put ourselves in a position of strength to do the things that we need and want in our City with the freedom from legacy debt that almost always affects the quality of life in cities like ours. I also believe a critical component to attracting new businesses and residents here is the affordability of Walker. We continue to be very deliberate about that strategy as well.

The increased investment in our parks, trails, and recreation continues so that we may provide more for our residents and visitors. However, all of that takes a plan and the Parks and Recreation Committee along with City staff are currently undergoing a major overhaul of our Parks and Recreation Master Plan. That will provide us with the strategies to invest in and implement. We expect to have parks, trails, and recreation which provide a cleaner, safer, and healthier community.

Last but certainly not least is quality of life. To me, this encompasses civility, community events, and just being proud of where we live, work, and grow. We are doing more events and with stronger participation from not just our residents, but those who have also found out what a special city we have. When you experience this first hand, it is almost impossible to not be caring and empathetic for one another, which in turns breeds that civility that Walker proudly represents. What a special community we have in our unity and working together in all that we do.

As we look to what 2023 will bring, I believe us to be in a better position than most in our priorities and the ability to execute them. There are so many good things happening but, most importantly to me, is the culture of our community of which so many want to be a part. We will continue to strengthen that in 2023.

PASSPORTS

The City Clerk's Department is a passport acceptance facility. Please contact the Clerk's Department at (616) 791-6865 to schedule an appointment or visit our website page at www.WalkerMI.gov/Passports for more information.

KEY POINTS TO REMEMBER

- Routine service is currently taking 6-9 weeks to process a passport.
- Expedited service is currently taking 3-5 weeks to process a passport for an additional charge of \$60 per application.
- The applicant must be present to apply for a passport.
- If the applicant is UNDER 16, both parents are required to appear with the applicant when they apply for their passport. If one of the parents is unable to be present that parent must complete a Minor Consent Form #DS-3053, which is available at travel.state.gov or in the Clerk's office.
- If the applicant is 16 or 17, only one parent needs to appear with the applicant when they apply for their passport.

City of Walker offers passport photo services for \$10.00 per person.

RENEWING A PASSPORT

YOU MUST RENEW BY MAIL IF YOUR MOST RECENT U.S. PASSPORT:

- Is **undamaged** and can be submitted with your application; **and**
- Was issued when you were **age 16 or older**; **and**
- Was issued within the last **15 years**; **and**
- Was issued in your current name or you can legally document your name change with an **original or certified copy** of your marriage certificate or the government-issued document evidencing your legal; name change.

2022 WALKER INCOME TAX RETURNS ARE DUE MAY 1, 2023

We will be happy to prepare your Walker return free of charge. Please call (616) 791-6880 for an appointment and a list of information you will need to bring. We are no longer able to prepare Walker returns using information submitted by email.

WORK FROM HOME IN 2022

If you are a Walker resident who usually works in another city with an income tax (for example, Grand Rapids), you must reduce the credit for tax paid to the other city for days worked from home. You will also reduce the amount of tax you pay to the non-resident city by allocating your wages for days worked from home. If you need help calculating non-resident taxable wages or the credit for tax paid to another city, you can call us at (616) 791-6880.



E-FILE YOUR WALKER INCOME TAX RETURN

We will be accepting 2022 Walker resident and non-resident returns by e-file. If you use a paid tax preparer that e-files your federal and state return, they will be able to e-file your Walker return also. If you use TaxAct software/online tax program to prepare your own federal and state returns, you will be able to e-file your Walker return. Visit the TaxAct site at taxact.com for more information. Please note that other software/online tax programs used for self-prepared returns (TurboTax, H&R Block, TaxCut) do not participate with Michigan local e-filing as of 1/1/2023. We are working with these popular software programs to encourage them to participate with Michigan local e-filing. Check the instructions when you print your 2022 Walker return to see if you need to mail a paper copy to us.

E-filed returns for tax year 2022 will be accepted beginning January 31, 2023. Processing of e-filed returns with refunds will not begin until mid-March. All W-2 forms due from employers by February 28 must be processed first.

ESTIMATED PAYMENTS

The first quarter estimated payment for 2023 Walker Income Tax is also due May 1, 2023. If your employer does not withhold Walker Income Tax or you have non-wage income (rental income, capital gains, premature pension distributions, etc.) that is subject to tax and you think you may owe more than \$100 with your 2023 return, you must make quarterly estimated payments. The 2023 Quarterly Estimated payment vouchers with instructions can be found:

You must pay in at least 70% of your current or prior year liability (whichever is lower) through timely estimates, credits or withholding to avoid receiving a bill for penalty and interest for underpayment of estimated tax. If you need help calculating safe estimates, please call us for assistance at (616) 791-6880.

Please note that paying all four 2023 quarterly estimates with the fourth quarter voucher due January 31, 2024 may result in a bill for penalty and interest for failure to pay timely estimates.

WHO MUST FILE

Every resident or part-year resident of Walker (this includes renters) who had taxable income in 2022 of \$600 or more must file a return. More information on taxable income can be found here: www.walkermi.gov/incometaxfaqs.

All Walker addresses have Grand Rapids mailing addresses so please do not assume you are not a Walker resident based on your mailing address. Visit the following link on the Walker website to check whether your address is within the city limits of Walker: www.walkermi.gov/streetdirectory.

If you have past years of Walker returns that you have forgotten to file, contact the tax department immediately at (616) 791-6880. If you file prior year returns and pay the tax and interest due, you may request a waiver of penalty. If the tax department contacts you first regarding unfiled returns, you will not be eligible for a waiver of penalty. We are continuing the process of electronically matching state of Michigan returns filed from a Walker resident address with Walker returns filed. If you have forgotten to file Walker returns from prior years, now is the time to get that cleared up before you receive an assessment from this compliance program.

By providing information about your household that you feel is important for us to know about at the time of an emergency, we can ensure you and everything you care about is protected to the best of our ability. WHAT KINDS OF INFORMATION CAN I PROVIDE?

Any information you provide through Community Connect is completely voluntary and based on what you are comfortable sharing.

HOW SECURE IS MY DATA AND HOW IS IT USED?

Data that you provide Community Connect is secure and is used only for the purpose of better serving you during emergency situations. Your information is never used for any other purpose. All logins are password protected with bank level encryption and security. If you're comfortable logging in to your online bank you'll be comfortable logging in to Community Connect.

HOW TO MAKE A FIRE ESCAPE PLAN

Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows. Visit each room. Find two ways out.

All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.

Make sure your home has smoke alarms and test them.

Pick a meeting place outside.

Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.

Talk about your plan with everyone in your home.

CONNECT WITH US

One of our main priorities this year will be bringing back some of the opportunities to connect with residents at various community events. COVID put a big damper on these types of events the past couple years, so look for us to be back out and about doing Coffee with a Cop, Cones with Cops, and other pop-up events both in Walker and in nearby cities as we partner with other agencies.



COMMUNITY EDUCATION SERIES

We will also be bringing back Community Education seminars as frequently as we can. Anytime we can get information out to the public, on a variety of topics, we will be doing that. We already held a seminar on how to spot counterfeit currency, so thank you if you attended that. Sharing information is a force multiplier when it comes to deterring crime and suspicious activity in our neighborhoods, so let us help you on ways to help us!



REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY AS IT'S HAPPENING

Speaking of suspicious activity, we'd like to extend a challenge for 2023. If you see something suspicious, **report it as it is occurring**. This gives officers the best chance to investigate the incident, or even catch criminals in the act. Stay in a safe place and be a good witness. Give the dispatcher as many real time updates as you can until officers arrive. The more eyes we have watching the streets, businesses, and neighborhoods, the better off we will be when it comes to deterring and reporting crimes. If you happen to have a surveillance system, take a moment to ensure it is in good working order and provides quality photo/video. While you should never assume simply having a camera will keep thieves away, cameras are still an important tool for investigation, as we can often times identify suspects through citizen photo/video.


Report It,
Don't Ignore It

Engineering Department

City engineers continue to transform old and outdated intersections, roads, and bridges into safer infrastructure for motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists. Here is a list of upcoming projects around the City.

KINNEY & REMEMBRANCE SIGNAL

The goal is to minimize the size of the intersection as much as possible. The crossing distance for most intersections is around 100-125'. Remembrance is almost 300'. The skewed shape can cause north and southbound left turners to close the distance on opposing traffic quicker than expected. By narrowing the intersection we can make it more friendly for pedestrians and safer for opposing traffic. The new traffic signals will be the mast arm variety with illuminated street name signs. All the improvements will be ADA accessible.



CENTER / WEATHERFORD ROUNDABOUT

The Green Ridge Shopping Center has had traffic snarls along the main entrance point since it's inception. With the new roundabout we hope to eliminate the cost of a new traffic signal and dramatically improve traffic flow. The improvement will also eliminate the awkward crossover that is often confusing to drivers. Drivers will be able to circle the roundabout and free flow into the Target Driveway, along with other options via Weatherford Drive. Pedestrian movements will also be enhanced. The project is going to be funded by a Carbon Reduction grant in 2024. We will plan to bid the project after sometime after October of 2023 and hopefully see implementation in the spring and summer of 2024.



BRISTOL /PANNELL BRIDGE

The current single lane bridge is 116 years old. We have secured grant funding to reconstruct the bridge with two - way traffic and a sidewalk to enhance pedestrian movements. Future plans for a sidewalk north of the new bridge include an expansion to the north in 2026. The project is funded with a regional Covid Relief Grant (HICU), a Surface Transportation Program (STP) grant, and Walker general fund dollars. The total construction cost for the bridge is currently estimated at \$2.5 Million. We are pushing hard to try and get the job bid in time for 2023 construction but it may slip into 2024. Supply chain issues will impact the bridge components.

KINNEY AVE IMPROVEMENTS

Kinney Ave will be reconstructed from Leonard Street south to Lake Michigan Drive in 2024. Improvements include widening the road to allow two travel lanes with curb/gutter and a center turn lane. Ditches will also be enclosed to allow for sidewalk on both sides of the street.

Believe it or not, yard work isn't just confined to the warmer months. Our Department of Public Works crews perform tree work in fall and winter.



You may have already seen our crews around the City trimming overgrown trees and shrubs. This is necessary so that vehicles, like snowplows and garbage trucks, can fit under tree branches.

Don't worry! Our crews will be cutting branches equally around to keep them uniform. Tree stumps will be removed in the Spring, and the area will be seeded and topsoiled. We appreciate your patience as crews work this in between their other duties.





Kent District Library Named Five-Star Library

Kent District Library has been recognized as one of America's Star Libraries, as rated by the Library Journal Index of Public Library Service. KDL received the highest score, a five-star rating. KDL was compared to other libraries with similar annual expenditures and received the top honor due to the extent that KDL patrons use the library. Scores and star ratings are based on circulation of physical materials, circulation of electronic materials, library visits, library program attendance, public internet users, Wi-Fi sessions, library website visits and E-retrievals (usage of online content such as databases). KDL had the highest program attendance per capita for any library in the index with a budget of \$10 million or more. "This award is a reflection that people use and place a high value on the services we provide," said Lance Werner, Executive Director at KDL. "The Star Library designation is welcome confirmation that KDL provides the library offerings that our residents want and need in their lives." The 2022 scores and ratings are based on fiscal year 2020 data from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) Public Library Survey (PLS). This year, 5,359 public libraries received LJ Index scores and 258 received Stars.


